PAINTS:

This selection is not strictly mandatory, however as a foundational selection you should have these or a similar collection available to you. Regarding brands and quality, there is no obligation to spring for the most expensive tubes of acrylic; while high-quality paint can be useful in abstract painting, improvisation and experimentation. I personally prefer Liquitex, Amsterdam or Golden tubes of acrylic paint as they tend to last quite a while.

SURFACES:

CANVAS

4-5 white canvases (stretched canvas or canvas board of your choice), recommended size 11 x 14" (pre-primed)

OTHER:

- PAINT BRUSHES:
- You may purchase any basic set of brushes or singular hog hair/synthetic brushes that appeal to you. I recommend having at least one large (2" 3" wide square) brush for covering large areas of the canvas as needed.

OTHER TOOLS:

- 1-2 reusable containers for containing paint water (i.e. a glass jar, yogurt container, or similar vessel)
- 3-5 HB pencils, 1 notebook or sketchpad for sketching
- A paint palette (may be replaced by a shallow container, i.e. damaged/chipped plate, pie tin, cheap plastic container)
- Painter's tape

OPTIONAL:

- Plastic sheet/table cloth (great for avoiding messes!)
- Gloss and/or matte varnish (to seal your finished painting)
- Palette knife/knives
- Gel Medium (adds thickness/body to paint, great for impasto work)
- Modeling Paste (great for additional texture in your paintings)
- Acrylic Flow Enhancer (helps to thin very thick paint, great for fluid work & abstract
- painting)
- Table Easel (floor easels are available in-studio)
- Tubs for water
